

The regular meeting for the month of January of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, January 10, 2022, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Thomas George, Dean Davis and Alan Dambach were present. Also present were Chris Reese, Michael Pszenny, Marilyn Zona, Tom Thompson, Amanda Peterson, Jay Griffin, Kathleen Griffin, Roy Raida, Jeremy Rice, Connie Johnston, Don King, Dean Steinbach, Shawn English and Barb Blinn.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the December 13, 2021 meetings, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE

WATER: The rules and regulations for the Water Department were discussed. Alan Dambach motioned to advertise for adoption an Ordinance repealing all former water related ordinances and adopting the rules and regulation by Resolution, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE The Township has still not had any correspondence from North Sewickley concerning a new water rate. The remaining meters and valves that need replaced were discussed. The Supervisors discussed again the request by Amy and Rich Wolfe for the possibility of them tapping into the water system. Jeremy Rice will work with Tom Thompson to come up with an estimate of construction. Dong King asked the Board if there is a possibility that the Township would consider extending the line on Herman Road.

SEWAGE: Tom Thompson reported that they are waiting on testing results to move forward with the application of renewal of the NPDES permit.

ROADS: Dean Steinbach and the Board discussed the first snow event that occurred the week before the meeting. There was discussion on call out versus Zelenople Lawn Care making the decision when to go out. It was decided to leave the call up to Zelenople Lawn Care and revisit it if there are problems. The Marion Township Police and the New Sewickley Police can still call out as needed. Connie Johnston and Don King discussed with the Board the problems they are having with accidents on the bend on Herman Road. They had four accidents during the first snow event. After much discussion, Tom Thompson will visit the site and make a recommendation to the Board.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of December, 2021 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 290 hours, Total Calls: 24, Mutual aid: 2, New Sewickley: 16 calls.

PLANNING COMMISSION: No report. Tom Thompson told the Board that he is reviewing a revised plan of the Caldwell subdivision.

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of December – Terreri - Shed

SOLICITOR: Attorney Reese reported that Senate Bill 191 concerning building laws for historic barns is still with Labor and Industry for review. The Supervisors will continue to wait for a resolution.

Alan Dambach motioned to appoint Mark Turnley, CPA to audit the 2021 books, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE
