

The regular meeting for the month of March of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, March 14, 2022, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Dean Davis and Thomas George were present with Alan Dambach joining the meeting by phone. Also present were Chris Reese, Mike Pzenny, Marilyn Zona, Tom Thompson, Jeremy Rice, Roy Raida, Don King, Mr. & Mrs. Griffen, Amanda Peterson, Shawn Baker, Kirby Double, Angela Conner, Lily Scott, Renee Scott, Dave Scott, Brenda Double and Barb Blinn.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the February 14, 2022 meeting, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE

The Supervisors presented certificates honoring the Riverside High School Archery Team for placing sixth in the NASP State Tournament and Lily Scott, a township resident, for placing second in the same tournament. Congratulations to all who placed and to the club for such an accomplishment.

WATER: Some of the purchased large meters must still be installed. The gate that had been placed by the Caldwell's at the North Sewickley meter pit was discussed. The gate has been removed. There are a couple of trees that have been felled on the access but it is still passable. The Wolfe's sent a letter to the board withdrawing their request for public water due to length of time for getting a quote, Mr. Rice advised the board that the estimate for extending the line to the end of Wolfe's property is \$26,000. North Sewickley has raised the rate the Township pays for water to \$4.98/1,000 gallons up from \$4.53. The Supervisors will monitor the budget this year to determine if a rate increase is necessary. Dean Davis motioned to adopt Resolution 2022-2, a resolution requesting a Statewide Local Share Assessment grant of \$691,800 from the Commonwealth Financing Authority for the Herman Road Waterline Project, Alan Dambach seconded. SEWAGE: The Supervisors will have the Solicitor send a letter to Veka advising them that they are in noncompliance of the Sewer Users Agreement that the Township has with Veka. They are not submitting quarterly discharge monitoring reports to the Township.

ROADS: The Herman Road bend was discussed. Tom Thompson and Jeremy Rice are to meet and decide how many signs are needed and get them ordered. There was a complaint about the condition of Steinbach Road. Jeremy Rice is to excavate the berm and patch the potholes. Road Inspection was set for April 19 at 9:00 a.m.

ENGINEER: No report.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of February, 2022 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 301 hours, Total Calls: 58, Mutual aid: 1, New Sewickley: 14 calls. The Supervisors will resubmit a Mutual Aid Agreement to Franklin Township for their approval.

PLANNING COMMISSION: The Caldwell lot line revision was discussed. The utility easements do not have to be on the plan for approval. Since the Township is aware of the runway easement it should be on the plan but it is not a reason to deny the plan.

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of February - none

SOLICITOR: Attorney Reese reported there has not been movement on House Bill 1037. The solicitor requested an executive session to discuss a potential litigation issue.

The Township received a dividend check of \$4,448.51 from EMC Insurance for the Keystone Municipal Insurance Program.

Dean Davis motioned to pay the bills, Alan Dambach seconded. Roll Call: Mr. George-yes Mr. Dambach-yes Mr. Davis-yes

The Supervisors went into executive session at 5:55 p.m. and returned at 6:15 p.m.

The Supervisors will have the Zoning Officer advise Novaley Skillman that she needs to apply for a conditional use permit for her day spa.
