

The regular meeting of Monday, April 7, 2014 was called to order at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Thomas George, Alan Dambach, and Dean Davis were present. Also present were Philip Lope, Rudolph Harkins, William Hummel, Marilyn Zona, Elnora Freshcorn, Doug Rice, Lonnie Vodenichar, Mark Carrier, David Hoover, and Roy Raida. Arriving later were Joseph Schwab, Douglas Mehan, and Robert Crissinger all from Penn Energy.

The minutes of the March 11, 2014 meeting were approved and adopted on a motion by Dean Davis, seconded by Alan Dambach. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE

The public safety building was discussed with Fire Department members, Vodenichar and Carrier. Mr. Dambach is hoping to deal with someone different at Honeywell. The Fire Department will need a place to store the truck when their new one comes in or the Township may lose the truck.

WATER: The Faller, Honeywell sewage plant and J B Booth need touch readouts. Toilet at Township building needs repair, water keeps running. North Sewickley is working near the North Sewickley meter pit again.

SEWAGE: No report.

ROADS: The Spring Road Report was reviewed: Steinbach Road: ok, Muller Hill Road: clean drain, fill hole at end, Lower Ben Venue: fill holes along lake, clean drains, grade hill, clean ditches, Paved Ben Venue: drain under Cooper driveway, Bridge Drive: patch holes, West Road: ok, Veka Drive: Liquid Fuels for area beyond fence, Nagel Road: potholes at lower end, Hart Road: clean ditch, Petrie Road: ok, Mecklem Road: cut ditches on top, raveling potholes at bottom, Householder Road: drain at Zona driveway, Herman Road: driveway at Goehring, pave upper half. The Supervisors requested that Mr. Rice give them an estimate on all work except for the paving on Herman Road. The Township will reapply to Penn Dot for Liquid Fuels monies for the area inside of the fence at Veka.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of March was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 344 hours, Total mileage: 2070 miles, Traffic stops: 3, Total Calls: 20, Mutual aid: 13. The Chief explained to the Board about the Police cars that Cranberry Township is auctioning. He also advised the Board that Workers Comp has denied the claim submitted for his heart attack. Alan Dambach motioned to restore the 15 vacation days to Chief Harkins that he used when he had his heart attack, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE

PLANNING COMMISSION: Doug Rice explained to the Board about the property on Hill Top Lane that is an existing land locked piece of property that is for sale. There were questions about if, when, or how the property was subdivided. The property has a tax parcel number and is an existing lot in the court house records. As long as the purchaser has right of way access and septic approval the Township cannot deny building on the lot.

ZONING: Building permits were issued in the month of March to Skillman- swimming pool and Acutran-roof replacement.

SOLICITOR: No report

The Township will be paying for disposal of electronics from cleanup day.
