

The regular meeting of Monday, June 9, 2014 was called to order at 4:00 p.m. at the municipal building. Supervisors Alan Dambach and Dean Davis were present. Supervisor Thomas George was absent. Also present were Philip Lope, Rudolph Harkins, William Hummel, Marilyn Zona, Elnora Freshcorn, Doug Rice, Brian Murphy, David Hoover and Dave Kopp.

The minutes of the May 12, 2014 meeting were approved and adopted on a motion by Alan Dambach seconded by Dean Davis. ADAYE DDAYE

WATER: Mr. Rice told the Board that the Faller and J B Booth meters still need changed. The J B Booth meter is a one inch meter and will cost approximately \$250. The Supervisors told Mr. Rice to change that meter.

SEWAGE: No report.

ROADS: The bids for Herman Road were opened. Youngblood Paving was low bidder at \$37,440, Wilson Excavating-\$40,800, Russell Standard-\$42,000, Protech Asphalt-\$42,192. Alan Dambach motioned to accept Youngblood Paving's bid as long as Engineer Hummel finds no problems with the bid documents, Dean Davis seconded. ADAYE DDAYE Mr. Rice reported on the summer road work progress. He also told the Board that Kay Dindinger is complaining about a pothole that keeps reoccurring on Bridge Drive. The pipe from the Dindinger driveway crosses under Bridge Drive and is rusted out and collapsing. Solicitor Lope advised the Board that the driveway pipe is not the Townships' responsibility even though it is under our right of way. Alan Dambach motioned to approve the contract for \$2400 with Coyner Enterprises for spraying the Township Roads, Dean Davis seconded. ADAYE DDAYE

ENGINEER: No report

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of May, 2014 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 360 hours, Total mileage: 2229 miles, Traffic stops: 17, Total calls: 26, Mutual aid calls: 9.

PLANNING COMMISSION: The Planning Commission met with Chuck Goodzinski of Crystal Springs Farm concerning the garden sharing program he is offering. They are continuing to work on the update to the Zoning Ordinance.

SOLICITOR: Attorney Lope is still working on the question of acreage of the Mount Pleasant Cemetery. He also received a call from Attorney Hamilton asking whether Scott Convery has started to install a new septic system. Currently, there is no visible work on the property.

The continuing quest to purchase some property from Honeywell for a Public Safety Building has the most recent offer of the Township doing the subdivision and paying Honeywell \$25000 for the property.

Alan Dambach motioned to place all the gas well lease money and the Act 13 gas well money in a separate account at Huntington, Dean Davis seconded. ADAYE DDAYE
