

The regular monthly meeting of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order at 4:00 p.m., Monday September 13, 2010, at the municipal building. Supervisors Thomas George and Alan Dambach were present with Dean Davis arriving 5

minutes late. Also present were Marilyn Zona, Philip Lope, Rudy Harkins, Elnora Freshcorn, Dave Kopp, Bob Hart, David Hoover, and Paul Blinn.

The minutes of the August 9, 2010 were approved and adopted on a motion by Alan Dambach, seconded by Tom George. TGAYE ADAYE

WATER: Mr. George reported that the estimated average daily use for Veka is 1200 gal/hr so they probably used 1800 gallon from the hydrant during their water break in July so the Supervisors decided not to send them a bill. Mr. George also reported that the hydrants have to be flushed after Beaver Falls' new process goes on line. Jeremy Rice will paint the hydrants.

SEWAGE: Dean Davis motioned to approve and sign the Monthly Sewage Report, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDFAYE

ROADS: Oliastro has completed the work on Mecklem Road and Bridge Drive. West Road resurfacing has not been done. Chief Harkins reported that a pothole on Petrie Road needs filled. Alan Dambach motioned to advertise for bids for snow removal, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE

POLICE: The Police Report was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 365.5 hours, Total mileage: 2445 miles, Arrests: 1, Citations issued: 17, Warnings issued: 16, Total Calls for August: 23, Mutual Aid Calls: 6. The Chief reported that the AED needs a new battery which will cost \$399. The AED Company has sent a letter to the Township that factory service and support for our AED will end December 31, 2011. The Chief priced a new AED and it will cost \$1395. Alan Dambach motioned to purchase a new AED, first checking with COG and the businesses in the Township to find out if any other departments or businesses are going to be purchasing to get a better price, Dean Davis seconded. PLANNING COMMISSION: No report.

ZONING: A building permit was issued to Matt Brewer for an addition to a house on Mecklem Road.

SOLICITOR: Attorney Lope reported that he reviewed the by-laws sent to us by the Butler County Sewage Association and had a letter for the Supervisors on the points he felt needed clarified. The Secretary will forward the comments to the Association. Attorney Lope also advised that the Township send a letter to the Railroad putting them on notice that the design of the bridge keeps emergency vehicles from crossing the bridge at West Road. Mr. Dambach and Attorney Lope will compose the letter and send it to the Railroad.

Mr. George thanked all the people who helped make the 11th annual Community Day a success.

The Secretary was instructed to contact the County Planning Commission about the Flood Plain Study and whether the County is trying to take over Flood Plain enforcement.

Paul Blinn told the Supervisors that he is a 57 year resident of the Township and he likes the Abitibi container for newspaper and office waste and magazines that the Township now has at the municipal building. He would like to see the Township recycle aluminum cans. He also complained about the problem he had with his pressure regulator on his waterline and felt the Township should have fixed it for him. Mr. George explained that it is the policy of the Township that the pressure regulator is the customer's responsibility.
