WATER: Bill Norris is going to install a surge protector and ground rod for the meter pit. Jeremy Rice and Supervisor George will flush the hydrants. The data recorder in the meter pit is not working.

SEWAGE: No report

ROADS: Petrie Road will be paved the end of September. The dirt side of Ben Venue still needs work.

ENGINEER: No report.

PLANNING COMMISSION: Great Southern Wood attended the Planning Commission meeting with tentative plans to asphalt the parking and storage area on the east side of West Road and to build a steel pavilion to store wood. They must produce a storm water runoff plan and will need a variance for the pavilion.

It was agreed that we would have a Supervisor, the Township Secretary and a citizen on the committee. Alan Dambach and Tom George will share the duty and the Supervisors appointed Jodi McElwain to the committee. Supervisor George suggested we contact Franklin and New Sewickley Townships to see if they would like to send a representative to the meetings.
