

The regular meeting for the month of August of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, August 8, 2022, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Thomas George, Alan Dambach and Dean Davis were present. Also present were Marilyn Zona, Tom Thompson, Amanda Peterson, Roy Raida, Tim Grech, Anthony DeJulia and Mr. & Mrs. Griffen.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the July 11, 2022 meeting, Alan Dambach seconded.

WATER: The Great Southern meter still needs replaced. The water line is losing a considerable amount of water with no obvious leak. More detection is planned. Dean Davis motioned to purchase new hydrant markers at 5 for \$142.53, a total of 20 to be ordered, Alan Dambach seconded. Dean Davis motioned to employ Lake Forest Gardens at \$42/hour to clean and paint the fire hydrants, Tom George seconded. Tom George-yes Dean Davis-yes Alan Dambach- abstain.

SEWAGE: The DEP violation penalty has yet to be resolved. Paul Kremer, Tom Thompson and Tom George met with Veka concerning problems at the plant. The Township is waiting for the new NPDES permit to assess what changes and replacements will need to be made. The weed problem at the plant will be addressed. Dean Davis motioned to adopt Resolution 2022-6, Plan Revision for New Land Development the Becker Planning Module, Alan Dambach seconded.

ROADS: The lone bid for snow removal was opened. Zelienville Lawn Care bid \$115.00/hour. Alan Dambach motioned to accept the bid from Zelienville Lawn Care, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE Hannah Ward from the Beaver County Conservation District met with Alan Dambach and Marilyn Zona at Ben Venue Road to discuss the possibility of applying for a grant for drainage work on the gravel part of Ben Venue Road. The summer road work has been caught up. Steinbach Road berms have been filled.

ENGINEER: Tom Thompson reported that the grant that the Township applied for a Herman Road waterline will not be awarded until after September.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of July, 2022 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 277 hours, Total Calls: 40, Mutual aid: 2 New Sewickley: 13. The speed sign has to be sent back for repair.

PLANNING COMMISSION: The Commission is working on a wind energy ordinance. The secretary suggested that the Commission take a look at regulations for Air B&B's.

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of July – none. Mr. Kopp has been issued a demolition permit for the property at 1174 Route 588, but did not apply for a demolition permit for 1192 Route 588. The Township will press for a date on the demolition and a permit for the 1192 property.

SOLICITOR: There has been no movement on the House Bill concerning the Blinn Wedding Venue.
