

The regular meeting for the month of August of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, August 9, 2021, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Thomas George and Dean Davis were present with Alan Dambach joining by zoom. Also present were Chris Reese, Michael Pszenny, Marilyn Zona, Tom Thompson, Jeremy Rice, Amanda Peterson, Nick Vercilla, Jay Griffen and Kathleen Griffen.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the July 12, 2021 meeting, Thomas George seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE

WATER: The YMCA meter and the valves for the North Sewickley pit have been received. The report of the meters that were tested was discussed. The North Sewickley pit meter test was good, the Veka meter is reading at 400 gal, should be 1000, the Great Southern meter is good, J J Kennedy is reading over, and the Honeywell meter was not able to be tested. Dean Davis motioned to replace the Honeywell, Veka, J J Kennedy, and Great Southern, Tom George seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE Supervisor George will schedule a meeting with Jeremy Rice and Tom Thompson to review Water Ordinance 87-2 and amendments for updating.

SEWAGE: Tom Thompson reported that the NPDES permit for the Veka plant must be renewed in March, 2022.

ROADS: The quote from Zelienople Lawn Care and contract had been reviewed and some wording changed. Dean Davis motioned to accept the quote and contract from Zelienople Lawn Care at \$107/hour with a 3 hour minimum, Tom George seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE The Mecklem Road project and the tar and chip of Hart Road has not started.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of July, 2021 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 312 hours, Total Calls: 28, Mutual aid: 2, New Sewickley: 19 calls. Chief Pszenny again discussed the problems with parking on Route 588 and Hartzell School near the kayak launch areas. Solicitor Lope researched placing no parking signs on private property and whether we need an ordinance to enforce the signs. The Township needs to pass an ordinance to enforce the signs. Dean Davis motioned to advertise an Ordinance to enforce no parking signs on Route 588 and Hartzell School Road and to place the signs where needed, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE Chief Pszenny advised the Board that the railroad representative appeared at the hearings for citations for trespass on the railroad bridge and that the defendants were found guilty.

PLANNING COMMISSION: No report

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of July –Great Southern – office building.

The Township received \$45,478.77 from the American Rescue Plan and \$66,488.17 from Act 13.

SOLICITOR: Attorney Reese advised the Board that the Senate bill 191 concerning building laws for historic barns not moved. The Supervisors will continue to wait for a resolution.

Dean Davis motioned to pay the bills, Tom George seconded. Roll Call: Mr. Davis – yes Mr. Dambach – yes Mr. George - yes
