

The regular meeting for the month of December of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, December 9, 2019, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Thomas George, Dean Davis and Alan Dambach were present. Also present were Chris Reese, Marilyn Zona, Bill Hummel, Jeremy Rice, Jacquie Zona, Gwen Nulph, Elmer Blinn and Dave Kopp.

Alan Dambach motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the November 11, 2019 meeting, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE

Jacquie Zona and Gwen Nulph spoke to the Board, asking to hold a 5K run along Hartzell School Road to benefit the Riverside pool repairs. They would like to hold the run in February. They would like to be able to use the Township Building as the starting point running towards the Custard Stand. They would need the Police to close the road. WATER: The Supervisors will meet with National Road to learn about advanced metering to allow meter reading through the cellular network.

SEWAGE: No report.

ROADS: Energy Transfer has requested the release of their bond for Ben Venue Road. Alan Dambach motioned to release the Bond as the work is complete and there are no problems along the road, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE Chief Pszeny presented his report of the study of speed limit for Herman Road. He recommended the speed limit be changed to 25 mph for the entire length of Herman Road. Alan Dambach motioned to advertise an Ordinance to set the speed limit for Herman Road at 25 mph, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE Supervisor Davis presented the bid from Traffic Logic for a Flashing Speed Limit Sign that is solar powered, the bid is \$2,809. Alan Dambach motioned to buy the Flashing Speed Limit sign from Traffic Logic, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE

ENGINEER: Mr. Hummel reported that he has been working with Great Southern Wood Preserve on storm water management for the project they are undertaking.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of November, 2019 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 344 hours, Total Calls: 47, Mutual aid: 3. Officer English is progressing very well. New Sewickley Township handled 13 calls in the month of November.

Supervisor Davis advised the Board that they had place a camera in the rental basement drain and that the whole drain needs replaced.
