

The regular meeting for the month of January of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, January 9, 2023, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Thomas George, and Dean Davis were present, Supervisor Dambach joined by zoom. Also present were Chris Reese Marilyn Zona, Mike Pszenny, Tom Thompson, Amanda Peterson, Jeremy Rice, Dave Kopp, Jay and Kathleen Griffen and Roy Raida.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the December 12, 2022 meeting, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE

WATER: The YMCA paid their bill from the meter mistake in full. The Township will place meter pits at the curb stop for Lukes, Reibold, Knauff, and Live Out Church.

SEWAGE: The generator at the sewage plant was repaired but needs to be replaced. Paul Kremer will get quotes on a new generator.

ROADS: The grant for the gravel end of Ben Venue Road was submitted to the State by the Conservation District.

ENGINEER: Tom Thompson reported that the Township has not received any word on the grant for Herman Road waterline. Tom told the Board that starting in 2024 the Township must have all water service lines documented as to their makeup. He suggested we start noting the lines now.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of December, 2022 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 271 hours, Total Calls: 28, New Sewickley: 15 Mutual aid: 2. Marion Township handled 448 calls for the year 2022 and New Sewickley handled 151. The Police Department is working on a new policy and procedure manual.

PLANNING COMMISSION: Roy Raida asked that Tom Thompson and Chris Reese review the wind power ordinance. The Commission will work on Planned Residential Development for the Zoning Ordinance.

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of December- none.

SOLICITOR: There has been some movement on the House Bill concerning the Blinn Wedding Venue but the solicitor is unsure what exactly it is and will check with Susan Bucknum for information.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and sign the addendum to the agreement with MDIA for the Uniform Construction Code Plan review and inspection services, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE

Mrs. Griffen asked if the Supervisors were considering a burning ordinance. The board asked that the solicitor look at incorporating some guidelines into the Nuisance Ordinance that the police could use if there was burning that was harmful or causing issues with neighbors.
