

The regular meeting for the month of June of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, June 14, 2021, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Dean Davis and Alan Dambach were present, Supervisor Thomas George was absent. Also present were Chris Reese, Michael Pszeny, Marilyn Zona, Tom Thompson, Jeremy Rice, Roy Raida, Dave Kopp, Shawn English and Emily Teets.

Alan Dambach motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the May 10, 2021 meeting, Dean Davis seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE

ROADS: The bids were opened for the paving project on Mecklem Road. Youngblood Paving was the low bidder at \$89.50/ton for a cost of \$35,263.00, ProTech Asphalt was \$91.93/ton for a cost of \$36,220.42, and Shields Paving was \$114.42/ton for a cost of \$45,081.48. Dean Davis motioned to accept the bid from Youngblood Paving contingent on the review by the Engineer of all bids, Alan Dambach seconded. DDAYE ADAYE Jeremy Rice will have estimates for the rest of the summer road work for the July 12 meeting. Veka Drive will be closed July 16, 17, & 18 because of railroad crossing maintenance. The emergency route through Veka and across the West Road bridge will be utilized.

Emily Teets addressed the board over concerns for the condition of her next door neighbor's property. She told of extremely high grass, weeds and rodents. The zoning officer will send a Zoning Enforcement Notice to the property owner citing the nuisance ordinance.

WATER: Jeremy Rice reported to the Board that the Honeywell Office meter has not been replaced with Beacon. The estimates on some of the meters and valves that the Township is considering replacing were reviewed. The Supervisors tabled the estimates so that Jeremy Rice and Tom Thompson can review them in depth. Water Ordinance 87-2 and amendments were discussed. The engineer, solicitor and supervisors will review them to revisit them at the next meeting. Alan Dambach motioned to have Laurel Management Company test our large meters, (J J Kennedy, Veka, Great Southern, Honeywell and North Sewickley and Zelianople meter pits) Dean Davis seconded. ENGINEER: Tom Thompson reviewed the Great Southern storm water plan for their new building. He will be in touch with them with a couple of issues with it.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of May, 2021 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 348.5 hours, Total Calls: 23, Mutual aid: 2, New Sewickley: 12 calls. There were no bids received for the Ford Expedition. Alan Dambach motioned to readvertise with no minimum, Dean Davis seconded. PLANNING COMMISSION: The Scrap/Junk ordinance will be advertised for next meeting. The Commission is working on the solar ordinance. They will interview candidates for the open Planning Commission member.

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of May – Dan Lynch - deck with roof

SOLICITOR: Attorney Reese advised the Board that there has been little movement Senate bill 191 concerning building laws for historic barns. The Supervisors will continue to wait for a resolution.

There were 55+ households that took advantage of Trash Day.

Alan Dambach motioned to accept the quote for the Township Insurance for the term July 1, 2021 thru June 30, 2022 from Kilmer Insurance, Dean Davis seconded. ADAYE DDAYE
