

The regular meeting for the month of March of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Tuesday, March 12, 2019, at 5:30 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Thomas George and Dean Davis were present, Supervisor Alan Dambach joined the meeting on the phone. Also present were Chris Reese, Marilyn Zona, Frank Evanson, Roy Raida, Jeremy Rice, Bill Hummel, Linda George, Don King, Barb Blinn and Richard Kline.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the February 11, 2019 Tom George seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE

WATER: The floor level in the North Sewickley meter pit has been raised to help in draining. Supervisor George will have the electrician install the surge protector and ground rod for the meter pit. Jeremy Rice and Roy Raida walked the line from the North Sewickley meter pit to check on area that had the slide in the past. They suggested it be monitored.

SEWAGE: No report.

ROADS: The tree has been removed on Herman Road as part of the plan to fix the water problem. The stump still has to be ground. Mr. Hummel will meet again with Jeremy Rice and Dean Davis to finalize the plan for the cement gutter, piping and drain. The Supervisors set Thursday April 4th for road inspection commencing at the Municipal building at 9:00 a.m. The Supervisors discussed some Penn Dot problem areas, Mueller Hill Road and Route 68 – sink hole, Nagel Road and Chapel Drive - a large hole developing around a drain, Chapel Drive and Hart Road – drain crumbling. The Supervisors would like to meet Energy Transfer concerning the pipe line crossing on Ben Venue.

ENGINEER: Mr. Hummel reported that the church storm water plans have been approved and they may apply for their building permit.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of February, 2019 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 315.5 hours, Total Calls: 17, Mutual aid: 0, Accidents: 3.

PLANNING COMMISSION: Working on updates to the Storm water Ordinance.

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of February - none

SOLICITOR: The leases that the Township had that were held by Abarta have been released by Abarta. They were from the Cemetery on Petrie Road and the Fombell Post Office that the Township no longer owns. Barbara Blinn attended the meeting and stated that she is again looking for an engineer and has made no progress in obtaining a building permit for their Wedding Venue. Frank Rice has not submitted an application for Conditional Use for his business. A list of problems and questions concerning Brush Creek Park, to be presented to the Beaver County Commissioners, has not been finalized.

The Prehearing telephone Conference on the condition and disposition of the West Road Bridge was held on March 7. Attorney Lope represented the Township. The judge has scheduled hearings on the matter to start June 24.

The Secretary solicited quotes from CPA firms for auditing the Township books because the Township Auditors have not done the work. Mark Turnley was the only firm that replied to the request. The quote was for \$5,000. They will ask DCED for an extension until May 1, 2019 to turn in the audit. Dean Davis motioned to accept the quote from Mark Turnley to audit the Township Books, Tom George seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE

The Township will team up with Franklin Township to hold an Electronic Recycling Day at the Franklin Township Municipal building on April 6 from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm. The Secretary will be sending a flyer to all Township residents.
