

The regular meeting for the month of November of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, November 9, 2020, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Dean Davis, Thomas George and Alan Dambach were present. Also present were Chris Reese, Michael Pszenny, William Hummel, Marilyn Zona, Amanda Peterson, and Jeremy Rice.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the October 12, 19 and 20, 2020 meetings, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE

WATER: Jeremy Rice reported to the Board that all the metering of the Beacon Metering system is complete except for the Honeywell Office meter. Larsen Design will meet with the Secretary to register the Township on Esri to begin using the GIS system. The line across the bridge has been charged and drained and is in good condition. Some of the valve boxes along the waterline will need repaired and raised. The blow off on Dambach Lane has not been installed.

SEWAGE: No report

ROADS: Jeremy Rice told the Supervisors the berms on Mecklem Road have been taken care of and all potholes have been filled. The cement work on Herman Road has not been done. The Blinn Brothers have cleaned the ditches on the gravel side of Ben Venue. The portion of Herman Road that was damaged by the construction of the pipeline has been repaired by Penn Energy.

ENGINEER: No report.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of October, 2020 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 351 hours, Total Calls: 31, Mutual aid: 1, New Sewickley: 8 calls. The police department passed out 26 treat bags on Halloween. The Chief will compile a list of stop signs that need replaced. The Township will receive \$21,477.68 from the Cares Act because of the Covid 19 Pandemic.

PLANNING COMMISSION: No report

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of October – Chappel - shed

SOLICITOR: Attorney Reese spoke with Susan Buckman concerning the Blinn Venue. There has been no movement on House Bill 1037. The ordinance for the fire department to have the ability to apply for reimbursement will be advertised for adoption at the December meeting.

The Secretary presented the 2021 Marion Township Budgets. General Fund total budget of \$965,740, State Fund total budget of \$82,213, Water Fund total budget of \$627,600, and Sewage Fund total budget of \$56,930. Dean Davis motioned to advertise the proposed 2021 Budgets for public inspection and then adoption at the December 14, 2020 meeting, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE ADAYE DDAYE
