

The regular meeting for the month of October of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, October 12, 2020, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Dean Davis and Thomas George were present, Alan Dambach was present on Zoom. Also present were Chris Reese, Michael Pszenny, William Hummel, Marilyn Zona, Amanda Peterson, Jeremy Rice, Shawn English and Roy Raida.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of September 14, 2020 meeting, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE

WATER: Jeremy Rice reported to the Board on the progress of the Beacon Metering system. The Honeywell office meter and Honeywell school meter has not been replaced yet. The two meters at the Martin residences also still need to be replaced. The meters that have been placed on the Beacon system are registering. Jeremy will meet again with Larsen Design to work on the mapping of the curb stops and valves. The hydrants have been flushed, the valves exercised and oiled. The Township will schedule a water tank inspection.

SEWAGE: No report

ROADS: The lone bid for snow removal was opened. Jenny LTD bid \$100/hours. Dean Davis motioned to accept and sign the contract with Jenny LTD for snow removal, Alan Dambach seconded. The Blinn Brothers are to do that work.

ENGINEER: No report.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of September, 2020 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 321.5 hours, Total Calls: 32, Mutual aid: 0, New Sewickley: 17 calls.

PLANNING COMMISSION: Roy Raida reported that the Commission did not meet in August. They discussed solar panels at their September meeting.

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of September – Bob Rice – new home.

SOLICITOR: Attorney Reese spoke with Susan Buckman concerning the Blinn Venue. There has been no movement on House Bill 1037.
