

The regular meeting for the month of September of the Marion Township Supervisors was called to order on Monday, September 13, 2021, at 4:00 p.m., at the municipal building. Supervisors Thomas George, Dean Davis and Alan Dambach were present. Also present were Chris Reese, Michael Pszenny, Marilyn Zona, Tom Thompson, Jeremy Rice, Roy Raida, Barb Blinn and Linda George.

Dean Davis motioned to approve and adopt the minutes of the August 9, 2021 meeting, Alan Dambach seconded. TGAYE DDAYE ADAYE

WATER: The replacement of the Veka water meter is complete. The Supervisors discussed the purchase of a shed for all of the equipment and parts that the Township owns. The Supervisors and Chief will get some prices and delivery time for the next meeting. Alan Dambach suggested a cement floor. Tom Thompson is going to send some standard rules and regulations for our water department to be reviewed. The tap for fire protection for Great Southern Wood is done.

SEWAGE: Tom Thompson reported that he will meet with Paul Kremer to start testing for the NPDES renewal. Consideration of upgrades to the sewage plant will wait until new NPDES permit.

ROADS: Mr. Rice reported that Steinbach, Mueller Hill and Ben Venue paved end road work is complete.

POLICE: The Police Report for the month of August, 2021 was submitted and approved as follows: Total hours worked: 344.5 hours, Total Calls: 60, Mutual aid: 2, New Sewickley: 9 calls. Chief Pszenny reported that the no parking signs on Route 588 and Hartzell School near the kayak launch areas are in place.

PLANNING COMMISSION: Roy Raida presented the solar ordinance to the Supervisors. The Supervisors had some questions concerning screening. They will have a final review at the October meeting.

ZONING: Building permits issued in the month of August – Otto Schellin- shed. The customer care guides for building permits are now listed on our website.

SOLICITOR: Attorney Reese reported that Senate bill 191 concerning building laws for historic barns is still with Labor and Industry for review. The Supervisors will continue to wait for a resolution. Attorney Reese presented Ordinance 2021-2, no parking near two areas by kayak launches, for adoption.
